

Programme structure of Master in International Relations

The programme is a two-year, 120 ECTS full-time study consisting of a basis of 40 ECTS in mandatory courses, 30 ECTS for the master's thesis and 50 ECTS for elective courses, internship and/or exchange studies. Students can also take a 60 ECTS master's thesis and no elective courses in Year 2.

Students make their individual study plans including mandatory and elective courses.

The program comprises five mandatory courses:

- EDS203 Introduction to International Relations (5ECTS)
- EDS374A International Relations Theory (10 ECTS)
- EDS312 Research Methods (15 ECTS)
- EDS374B International Relations Theory (10 ECTS)
- M30-IR Master Thesis (30 ECTS)

In addition, they can choose from among the following IR elective courses:

- EDS379 Global Political Economy (10 ECTS, yearly autumn)
- EDS381 Feminist and Critical IR (10 ECTS, bi-annually even years autumn)*
- EDS380 International Organizations (10 ECTS, bi-annually odd years spring)*

- <u>EDS378 State Building and Conflict in Fragile States</u> (10 ECTS, bi-annually odd years spring)*
- EDS376 Religion, Politics and Islam (10 ECTS, bi-annually even years spring)*
- EDS333 Washington Environmental Workshop (10 ECTS, in June block)**
- EDS372 Security Studies (10 ECTS, bi-annually odd years autumn)*
- EDS383 Global Transitions and the City (10 ECTS, bi-annually odd years autumn)*
- EDS391 Understanding Post-Conflict Police and Security Reform (10 ECTS, bi-annually even years spring)
- EDS313 Internship (10, 20 or 30 ECTS, offered in spring or autumn)
