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Objectives: The course is designed to provide a practical understanding of economic integration and importance of the multilateral trading system (the WTO in particular) as a platform to address issues or voice concerns related to trade in goods and services (with special emphasis on the Agreements on Agriculture, Sanitary and Phytosanitary measures, and Technical Barriers to Trade). Finally, trade policy and agricultural programs in selected importing and exporting countries are discussed in terms of their compliance with WTO Agreements. Specifically, the student is expected to develop:

- **A** a conceptual framework for understanding the economic implications of regional integration versus the WTO's multilateral trading system; and
- A the ability to assess trade policies and agricultural programs of a country to determine whether such policy is compliant with a country's WTO commitments.
