

## Proposed resolution:

We need a plan to implement measures (e.g., social activities) for the first and second-year students can take part it to foster comradery and social cohesion. Funds for social events are available. We also need to have activities that include the faculty for the students to meet with us informally (e.g., BBQ outside Tower Building). We will need some social event to welcome the international students who will join us physically in January 2021.
